Glossary

ADP Employment Change:

Private-sector payroll estimate published by ADP, often used as a preview of the official Nonfarm Payrolls report.

Advanced Goods Trade Balance:

Preliminary estimate of the US trade balance covering goods only, released ahead of the full trade balance report that includes services.

Challenger Job Cuts:

Tracks announced corporate layoffs, providing insight into labor market conditions.

Chicago Fed Activity Index:

Broad measure of US economic activity.

Construction Spending:

Measures total spending on residential and non-residential construction projects, reflects overall economic activity.

Consumer Confidence:

Consumer expectations on income and jobs and overall economic conditions.

Consumer Credit:

Total borrowing by households.

Consumer Sentiment (UoM):

University of Michigan survey of the consumer outlook on current and future economic conditions.

Continuing Claims:

Measures number of individuals still receiving unemployment benefits, indicating ongoing labor market trends.

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Glossary (continued)

**CPI:**

Consumer Price Index. Measures consumer price changes, a key inflation gauge.

Current Account Balance:

Broadest measure of international transactions, including trade in goods, services, income, and transfers.

Dallas Fed Index:

Tracks business and manufacturing activity in the Texas region.

Dallas Fed Services Activity:

Survey of business conditions in the services sector across the Texas region, measuring trends in revenue, employment, and outlook.

Durable Goods Orders:

Orders for long-lasting goods and equipment, typically used as an indicator of business investment.

Empire Manufacturing:

Survey of manufacturing activity in the New York region, providing early insights into industrial conditions.

Existing Home Sales:

Tracks sales of previously owned homes, indicating overall housing market activity.

Factory Orders:

Tracks new orders placed with manufacturers.

Federal Budget Balance:

Difference between a country's government revenue and spending.

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Glossary (continued)

**FOMC Minutes:**

Summary of discussions from Federal Open Market Committee meetings, provides insights into US Fed's policy decisions.

GDP:

Gross Domestic Product. Total value of goods and services produced within an economy.

Household Net Worth Change:

Tracks changes in total household assets minus liabilities, reflecting shifts in consumer wealth and financial conditions.

Housing Starts:

Tracks the number of new residential construction projects initiated.

Import Price Index:

Measures changes in the prices of goods and services imported into the country, serving as an indicator of imported inflation.

Industrial Production:

Measures output of factories, mines and utilities.

Inflation Expectations:

Compiles the forecasts of future price changes.

Initial Jobless Claims:

New filings for unemployment benefits.

ISM Manufacturing:

Published by the Institute for Supply Management, tracks activity in the US manufacturing sector.

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Glossary (continued)

**ISM Services:**

Published by the Institute for Supply Management, measures business activity in the US services sector.

JOLTS:

Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey. Tracks job openings, hiring, and turnover.

Kansas City Fed Services Activity:

Survey of business conditions in the services sector across the Kansas City Federal Reserve district, tracking trends in activity, employment, and prices.

KC Fed Index:

Manufacturing activity in central US region.

MNI Chicago PMI:

Survey of business conditions in the Chicago area, measuring manufacturing and non-manufacturing activity.

New Home Sales:

Measures sales of newly constructed homes, reflecting demand in the housing market.

NFP:

Nonfarm Payrolls. Measures US job growth, excluding agriculture. A key indicator of labor market strength.

NFIB Optimism:

Measures small business confidence in economic conditions and business prospects.

NY Fed Services Activity:

Survey of business conditions in the New York region's services sector, measuring trends in activity, employment, and prices.

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Glossary (continued)

PCE:

Personal Consumption Expenditures. Tracks consumer spending and inflation trends, US Fed's preferred inflation indicator.

Pending Home Sales:

Measures signed contracts for home purchases, serving as a leading indicator of future home sales.

Philly Fed Index:

Manufacturing conditions in Mid-Atlantic region.

PMI:

Purchasing Managers' Index. Measures business activity; signals growth or contraction.

PPI:

Producer Price Index. Tracks prices producers receive for goods.

Regional Fed Activity:

Indications of business conditions across Federal Reserve districts.

Retail Sales:

Measures consumer spending at retail stores, and is a key indicator of consumption trends.

S&P Global PMI:

Purchasing Managers' Index. Global survey of business activity trends.

Trade Balance:

Difference between a country's exports and imports.

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
